

FOOTNOTES

1. A footnote is either a direct quotation or an idea that you paraphrased from a source other than yourself.
2. A footnote can either take the form of:
 - a. A sentence or two surrounded by quotation marks.
 - b. A couple of sentences or short paragraph, indented on both sides and single spaced.
3. The MLA method of citing a footnote is:
 - a. "Quotation" (author's last name, page # from source)
 - b. Paragraph
*Indent*Quotation*indent*
*indent*Quotaton*indent*
*indent*tQuotation*indent*(author's last name, page # from source)
4. Always add a full citation of the sources you used for your footnotes in your works cited.
